Sadly the cafe opening has been delayed due to subsidence issues in Friary House. While the subsidence is being monitored Katia plans to serve a range of hot and cold drinks as well as healthy snacks from a trailer next to the house.

Katia said: "My husband, sons and I live very close to Friary Park and know it really well. As well as bringing my experience from running my own cake baking business, I'm looking forward to using my knowledge from working in the food industry into our new venture.

"We would really like to renovate the existing rundown cafe and provide high quality healthy food using free range & organic local products for park visitors, dog lovers, children and local residents. We plan to host special events including children's birthday parties, small gatherings and various celebrations. Our menu will feature kosher and halal preferences and are enthusiastic about offering discounted meal deals, coffee cake specials as well as afteroon tea deliveries to our seniors

Free to play sessions are available Mon-Fri 10-11am, 4-5pm and 5-6pm across all of the borough's tennis courts.


Help us report pollution
